

















Congreso Scoreboard for FY09

<i>Our youth are on track towards graduation.</i>		
Attended school regularly:		736 youth (91%)
Increased numeracy skills (passing Math for in school students):		266 youth
Increased literacy skills (passing English for in school students):		522 youth
Did not enter or re-enter juvenile justice system:		68 youth (96%)
Avoided first pregnancy or repeat pregnancy:		126 youth (93%)
Graduated from high school or obtained a GED:		20 youth (100%)
<p>Pan American Academy students exceeded expected growth by twice the expected rate¹.</p> <p>70+ students who didn't consider college an option are attending Harcum at Congreso.</p> <p>150 students who were previous high school drop outs are re-engaged and attending El Centro de Estudiantes.</p> <p>59% (10) students in Teen YET Center demonstrated more than 2 years of Academic growth.</p> <p>In Exito, 30% of students (7/24) are no longer at risk for dropping out because their school attendance exceeded 80%; 53% of students (10/19) are no longer at risk for dropping out because they went from failing to passing English ; and 62% of students (13/21)are no longer at risk of dropping out because they went from failing to passing Math.</p>

<i>Our adults are moving towards self-sufficiency.</i>		
Increased financial management knowledge:		155 adults
Built financial assets:	19  97 homes prevented from foreclosure \$771,637 in tax returns	436 adults
Obtained and remained in a good job for 6 months:		75 adults (65%)

<i>Our clients are overcoming barriers to education and employment goals while living safer and healthier lives.</i>		
Enrolled in entitled benefits:		1,499 people (82%)
Increased knowledge about nutrition and disease:		862 people
Increased knowledge about situations that lead to domestic violence:		391 people
Increased parenting knowledge:		45 parents
Strengthened healthy parental attachment to their children:		19 parents
Improved behavioral health:		77 people

Note that the above outcomes relate to only those programs that are designed to impact that outcome, and therefore the raw numbers of clients achieving the outcomes are smaller than the total clients served throughout the agency.

Also note that many clients who made progress in one outcome also made progress in other outcomes. For example, several youth who attended school regularly also made progress in behavioral health and/or avoided involvement in the juvenile justice system.
