NUESTRAS HISTORIAS OUR STORIES

An Extraordinary Partnership

Añia Simpson started at Congreso as an intern from Temple last spring when she forged a friendship with Señora Angela Rios, a client originally from Puerto Rico in Congreso's VIDA program. Añia wanted to work on her Spanish so that she was prepared to study abroad in Cuba in the fall. Señora Rios wanted to learn how to speak English and to read and write; motivation was the glue between these two women. Señora Rios and Ania joined together and began tutoring each other throughout several weeks to help each other achieve their respective goals. After months of kindness and determination, Señora Rios can now write her name and Ania walked away with a better understanding of the Spanish language.

Señora Rios recalled the challenges and frustration of not being able to read receipts or important forms. She shared, "I feel happier now that I can recognize letters...I can't wait to send a card to my family and be able to write the address on the envelope." Añia proudly stated, "She started at zero and it's amazing to see how far she has come."





Elina Excels

Elina Mushimiyimana, born and raised in the Republic of Congo, arrived in Philadelphia several years ago from Kenya and was looking to complete her GED. Luckily, Elina found Congreso's E3 Program. Whether adults are looking to return to an academic environment to complete their GED or have decided to further their education by obtaining an associate's degree from Harcum College, Congreso provides a variety of educational resources to the community. With self-determination and support from Congreso staff members, Elina graduated from the E3 program with her GED and enrolled in Congreso's Next Step program which supports 16 to 24 year olds to pursue education or employment opportunities.

After working hard and excelling at Congreso, Elina is now enrolled in the nursing program at Lincoln University! Elina shared, "Being involved with Congreso has helped me to keep moving and get what I want in life. To me, Congreso is like my home."

Responding to Hurricane Maria

On September 20, 2017, Puerto Rico felt the full force of Hurricane Maria.

With the devastating destruction evident, it became clear that there was a need to mobilize support and resources here in our community to rally behind the island and its people.

The devastation in Puerto Rico inspired local community leaders, organizations, and elected officials to establish a coordinated effort through Unidos PA' PR to respond to the immediate needs of the people of Puerto Rico. Through the collaborative initiative, over \$250,000 was raised and thousands of pounds of donated items were collected.

Following the arrival of many Puerto Rican evacuees to our community, Congreso joined the Greater Philadelphia Long-Term Recovery Committee (GPLTRC) to join the efforts in supporting and welcoming these new families to our community. We thank all of the individuals, organizations, and corporations that lead and supported these efforts.







Pan-American Academy Celebrates 10 Years

10 years of growth. Pan American Academy Charter School celebrated their 10 year anniversary at the 2018 Festival de Sueños in May. Founded by Congreso in 2008, the K-8 school now offers a bilingual international baccalaureate experience to over 750 students. Congreso joined many in celebrating the history and current success of PAACS.

2018 also featured the opening of the Annex, providing students at PAACS additional room to learn, play, and grow. After months of planning and construction, the Annex was completed in August 2018 and features a gymnasium, music room, creative classroom space, and a special events venue.

Congreso is proud to support the amazing students, staff, and families at PAACS and looks forward to continued partnership!

New Homes, Full Hearts

This past fiscal year, Congreso helped 55 clients purchase a home for the first time. Through Family and Housing Services, a bilingual homeownership workshop is available for interested home buyers. During the one-day course, participants receive information and resources about house counseling, the role of realtors, homeowner's insurance, and foreclosure prevention. Clients leave with a sense of hope, gratitude, and excitement, while our experienced team of housing counselors are dedicated to supporting our clients in achieving their dream of owning a home.

Our partner, Aramark, also eased the process this year by providing 55 first time homeowners with "welcome home" baskets filled with all types of home supplies!



Improving Health, Improving Lives

In Fiscal Year 2018, the Congreso Health Center was able to serve 3,585 patients, for a total of 10,953 patient visits. 20% of these patients served were uninsured.

The Congreso Health Center welcomed a Licensed Clinical Social Worker to the team in November 2017, which now allows the center to have fully integrated behavioral health services for our patients. This exciting addition has assisted the health center staff in ensuring that patients with chronic physical conditions have the tools they need to manage their disease, and that patients with mental health and substance use disorder needs are assessed, counseled and referred for appropriate treatment.

In February 2018, the Congreso Health Center partnered with the Fox Chase Mammogram Van, in order to provide free mammograms to uninsured and underinsured patients. 35 women were able to obtain free, on-site mammograms on that day. Out of these 35, 7 were found to have an abnormal mammogram, 6 of whom were uninsured. The 6 uninsured women have been connected to Fox Chase's Healthy Woman program for further diagnostic testing and treatment. This lifesaving cancer detection and treatment is especially important for Congreso's uninsured patients, who may not have access to detection and treatment outside of this service.



TAKING CARE OF



We are always seeking ways to enhance our work environment and take care of the Congreso Familia!

In July of 2017, a Staff Appreciation Committee was formed to celebrate and continue to foster community among our Congreso Familia. Since its creation, the committee has hosted events including happy hours, "recess" lunch events, holiday events, miniature golf, and ice skating for both staff and their families! In addition, the committee implemented a weekly "Monday Motivation" email to greet staff in their inboxes as they return from the weekend. At Congreso, we recognize the value of fostering a culture of community and self-care because our colleagues go above and beyond to support our clients often facing challenging issues and circumstances.

Also in July of 2017, Congreso adopted new family friendly policies, including options to work remotely and bring children to the workplace. We recognize that child care emergencies occur and want to ensure that our staff have the flexibility to work with their supervisors to find a solution that works for everyone. Furthermore, we updated our Tuition Assistance Policy to allow a \$800 reimbursement per semester for regular full-time and part-time staff who attend Harcum College at Congreso.

In January of 2018, Congreso kicked off a Wellness Initiative to encourage and support staff to live more healthfully. The initiative has included smoothie days, guided meditation, recipe sharing, and more. The campaign has been coordinated by Executive Administrator & Board Liaison Andrea Martinez who shared this piece of advice for staff, "Bring positive energy into your life and improve your mood by having positive thoughts, meditating, getting exercise, eating well and focusing on gratitude."
